
ANALYSIS REPORT OF STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY

The student satisfaction survey aimed to assess various aspects of the academic experience, including syllabus coverage, teaching quality, communication, evaluation fairness, and overall support for student growth. The survey included a range of questions focusing on these areas, and the results provide valuable insights into student perceptions. 923 students participated in students' satisfaction survey and more than 75% were found to be satisfied.

Key Findings

1. Syllabus Coverage


• **Result**: 85% of students felt that a substantial portion of the syllabus was effectively covered during classes.

2. Teacher Preparation


• **Result**: 77% of respondents rated their teachers as well-prepared for classes.

3. Communication Skills


• **Result**: 84.2% felt that teachers communicated effectively, enhancing understanding and engagement.

4. Teaching Approach


• **Result**: Students described the teaching approach as e.g., engaging, interactive, with 76% favoring this description.

5. Internal Evaluation Fairness


• **Result**: 92% of students felt that the internal evaluation process was fair and transparent.

6. Opportunities for Learning and Growth


Result: 81% of students agreed that the institution provides multiple opportunities for personal and academic development.

7. Job Possibilities Guidance


 Result: Only 66% reported receiving adequate information about job opportunities after course completion.

8. Follow-Up on Classes and Assignments


o **Result**: 89% indicated that teachers conduct necessary follow-ups on classes and assignments.

9. Encouragement to Perform Better


• **Result**: 92% of students felt that their teachers actively encouraged them to improve their performance.

10. Identification of Weaknesses


• **Result**: 77.2% believed teachers effectively identify their weaknesses and assist in overcoming them.

11. Responsiveness to Queries


Result: 82.3% reported that teachers are responsive to student inquiries.

12. Encouragement in Extracurricular Activities


• **Result**: 85.6% felt encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities.

13. Development of Soft and Life Skills


• **Result**: 78.3% noted that efforts are made to cultivate soft skills, life skills, and employability skills.

14. Use of ICT Tools in Teaching


Result: 64.3% of teachers utilized ICT tools such as projectors and multimedia during lessons.

15. Admission Process


Result: 86% of students found the admission process effective.

16. Attracting Meritorious Students


Result: 77% agree that the college attracts high-achieving students.

17. The faculties are updating their knowledge and skills.


• **Result**: 84.2% of respondents noted that faculty regularly update their knowledge and skills.

18. The class work is taking place as per schedule


o **Result**: 89% confirmed that class work follows the scheduled timetable.

19. Library as an Information Resource


o **Result**: 79.3% view the college library as a major source of information.




 Implication: Strong library services enhance academic performance; consider expanding resources.

20. Library Issue/Return Process


o **Result**: 83.3% rated the issue/return process as satisfactory.




- o **Implication**: Efficient systems are in place; minor improvements may enhance user experience.

- **Result**: 70.6% rated the availability of course books as adequate.




- o **Implication**: While generally satisfactory, continuous updates to the collection are necessary.

- o **Result**: 82.7% believe the library is optimally utilized by students.




- o **Implication**: Promoting library services can further increase usage.

- o **Result**: 83.8% rated the library management as effective.




- o **Implication**: Strong management practices contribute to user satisfaction; ongoing training may benefit staff.

- o **Result**: 85% find the library hours convenient.




- Implication: Flexible hours accommodate student needs; consider feedback for potential adjustments.

- o **Result**: 84.1% rated teaching aids as sufficient and up-to-date.




- o **Implication**: Keeping resources current is essential; periodic reviews of teaching tools are recommended.

- o **Result**: 75.8% felt classrooms and furniture were adequate.




- o **Implication**: Facilities meet student needs, but continued assessment for improvement is advisable.

- o **Result**: 69.7% reported that buildings and furniture are well-maintained.




- Implication: Regular maintenance practices are effective; continue to prioritize facility upkeep.

- o **Result**: 75.5% indicated labs are adequately equipped.




- o **Implication**: Well-equipped labs support practical learning; ongoing evaluations are necessary.

- o **Result**: 79.2% believe the department infrastructure is optimally used.




- o **Implication**: Effective utilization suggests good planning; assess for potential enhancements.

- o **Result**: 81% felt parking facilities are adequate.




- Implication: Sufficient parking supports student convenience; monitor for future growth needs.

- o **Result**: 75.8% confirmed the availability of safe drinking water.




- o **Implication**: Essential services are in place; regular checks are recommended to maintain quality.

- o **Result**: 78.1% rated sports infrastructure as adequate.




- o **Implication**: Support for physical activities is present; explore opportunities for other enhancement.

- o **Result**: 71.2% rated the college security system positively.




- Implication: Strong security measures are appreciated; extra number of security staff will be beneficial.

- o **Result**: 68% found disciplinary measures satisfactory.




- o **Implication**: Effective policies are in place; ensure ongoing communication about these measures.

- o **Result**: 67.2% rated administrative services positively.




- o **Implication**: Efficient administration supports student experience; continue to solicit feedback for improvements.

- **Result**: 90.5% felt information regarding activities and scholarships is displayed properly.





- o **Result**: 45.5% rated toilet cleanliness as good.




- o **Implication**: Clean facilities are essential for student satisfaction; increase monitoring for further improvement.

Recommendations

- **Review Evaluation Processes**: Conduct a comprehensive review of internal evaluations to ensure fairness and transparency.
- Strengthen Support for Personalized Learning: Encourage teachers to provide individualized feedback and support.

Conclusion

The student survey revealed overwhelmingly positive feedback, with the majority of parameters scoring above 70%. This indicates a strong overall perception of teaching quality and institutional support among students. Many respondents expressed satisfaction with their

learning experiences, highlighting effective instruction and helpful resources. However, the results also identified areas for targeted improvement. Specifically, students emphasized the need for enhanced career guidance and better integration of technology in the learning process. Addressing these concerns could significantly enrich the student experience, making it more relevant and engaging. By focusing on these specific aspects, the institution can further bolster its strengths while ensuring that all students feel adequately prepared for their future careers. Overall, the survey underscores a solid foundation of positive feedback, with clear pathways for ongoing improvement that align with student needs and aspirations.
