The questionnaire contained different aspects of satisfaction level of parents regarding the facilities, infrastructure of college, discipline, quality of teaching etc. Suggestions were also taken for improvement in future.

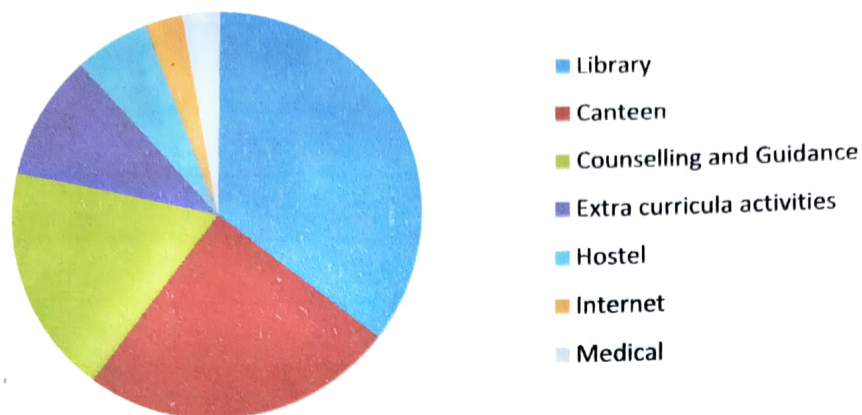
According to table 1, parents of 45 students expressed satisfaction, five parents stated dissatisfaction regarding discipline of college. Question concerning information to the parent from the student about their own performance, 48 parents affirmed positively while two parents denied it. 42 parents confirmed about getting regular information from faculty while 8 parents denied it. 48 parents expressed satisfaction in the examination system used for evaluating their ward. Only one parent expressed dissatisfaction on the quality of teaching in the institute while 49 parents were satisfied with the quality of teaching in the institute.

Fig. 1 demonstrates that most of the parents were satisfied with library facility. Other aspects with which they were happy and satisfied were canteen facility, counseling and guidance provided by faculty to the students, hostel, internet and medical facility.

Suggestions were also taken from the parents for improvement in future in the institution. Most of the parents highlighted the requirements of more washrooms especially for girls and their cleanliness. There were suggestions for the improvement of college library in terms of seating capacity and more facilities like availability of computers, Photostat facility of library books etc. Hygiene and cleanliness of college campus, more seating capacity in canteen was also emphasized by parents. Cleanliness of campus, proper drinking water facility, encouragement of sports, needbased requirement of repairwork was also stressed by the parents. Many parents also expressed concern over the indulgence of the outsiders in the campus. Some also underlined the need of proper laboratories in some departments.

FACULTY FEEDBACK FORM 2023-24

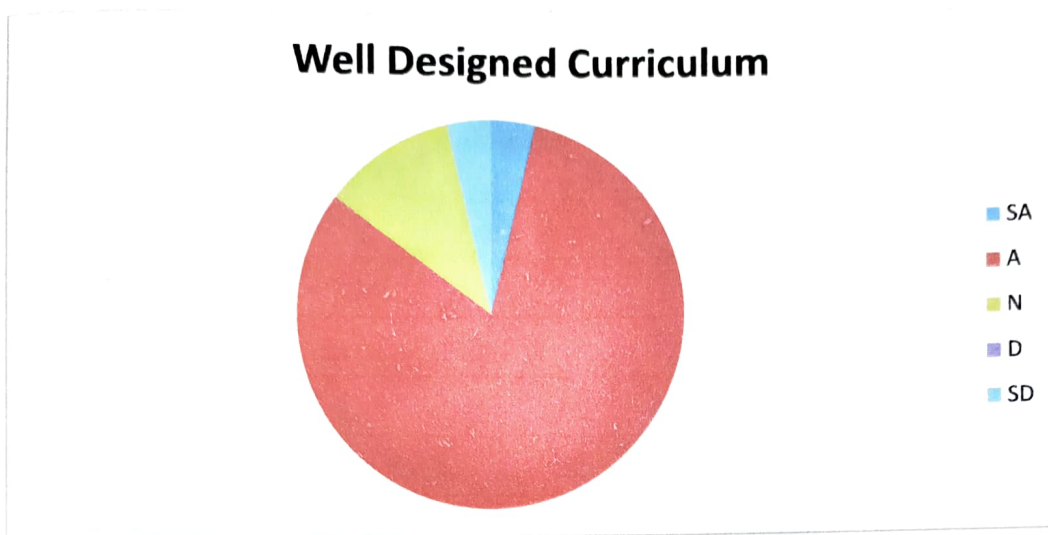

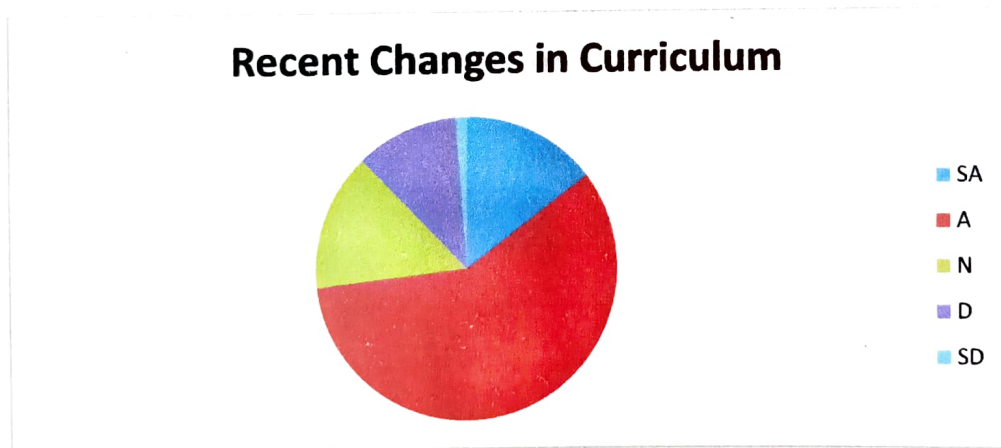

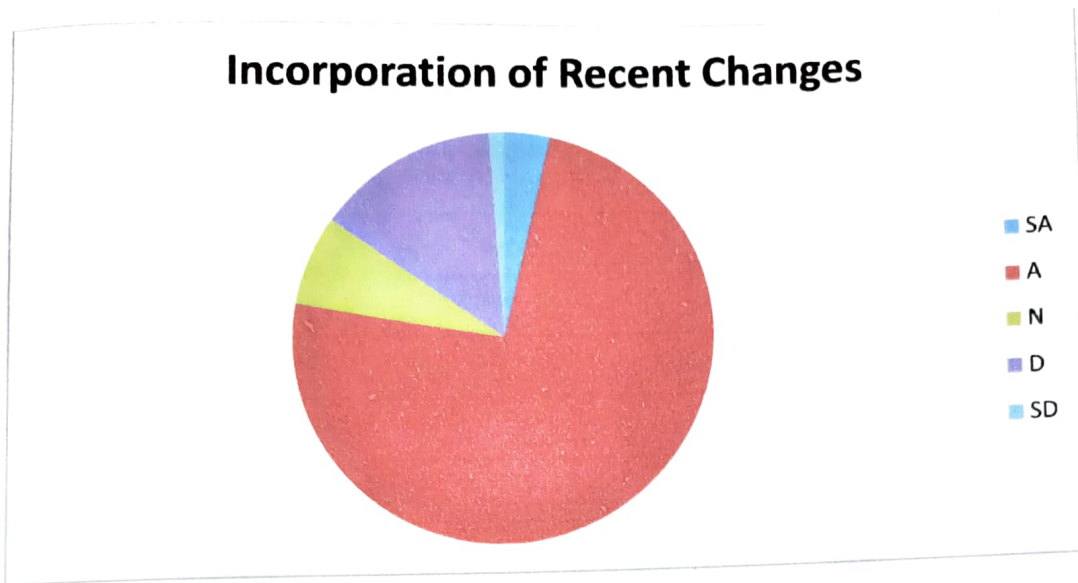

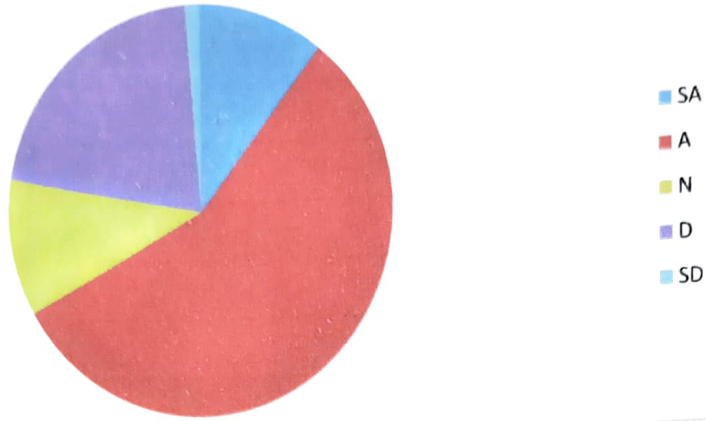

Updation of Curriculum

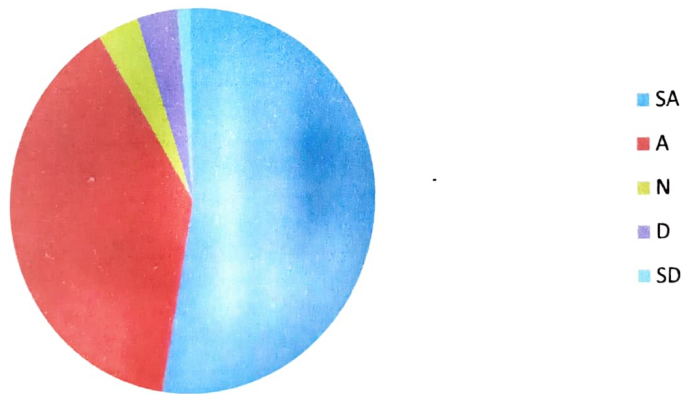

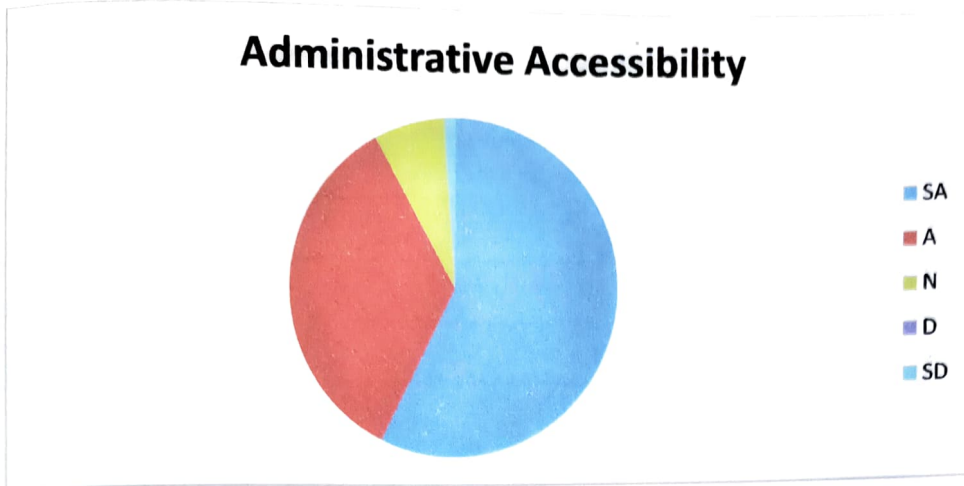
Administrative efforts for development

54 percent strongly agreed regarding the administrative efforts for development of the institution while 39 percent agreed to this. (Fig 7)

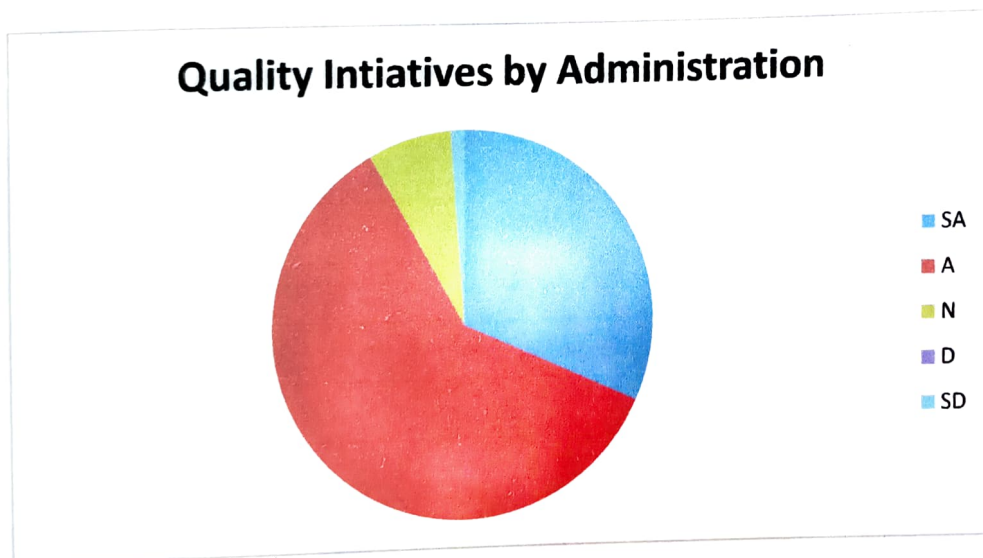

57 percent strongly agreed to easy accessibility of the administration while 35 percent agreed to this point.

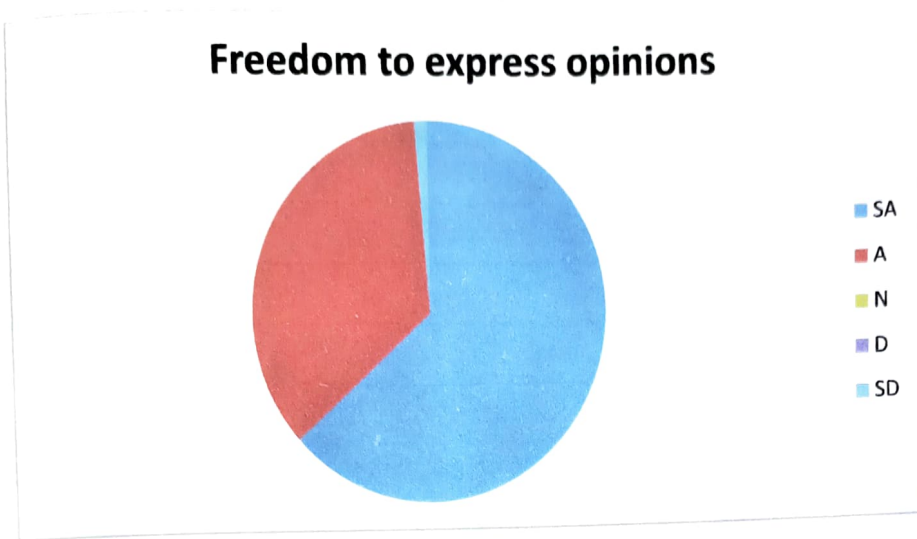

60 percent agreed to the steps taken towards quality improvement by the administration while 32 percent strongly agreed to this. (Fig 9)

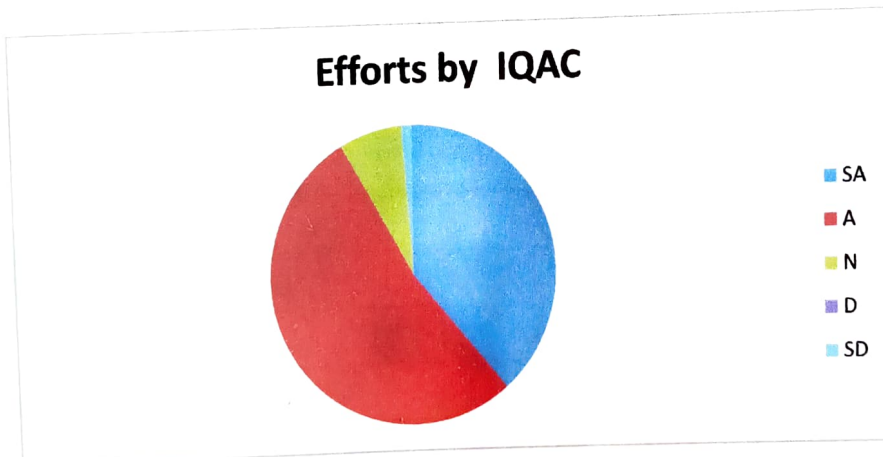

64 percent strongly agreed that they have freedom to express their opinions whenever required. 35 percent also agreed to it. (Fig 10)

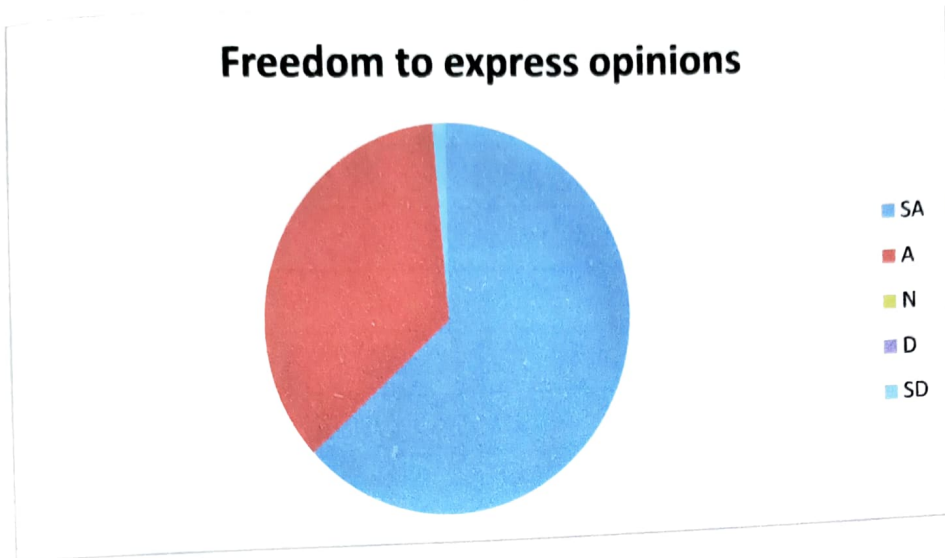

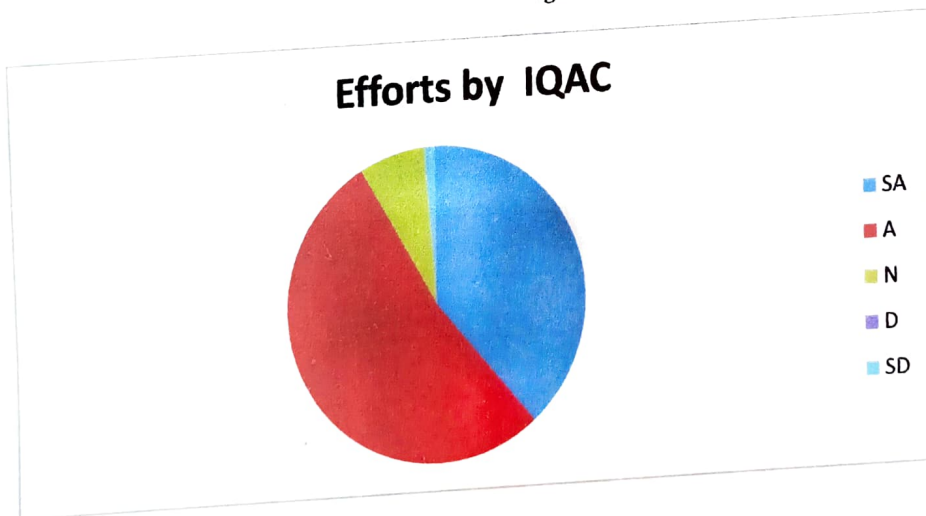
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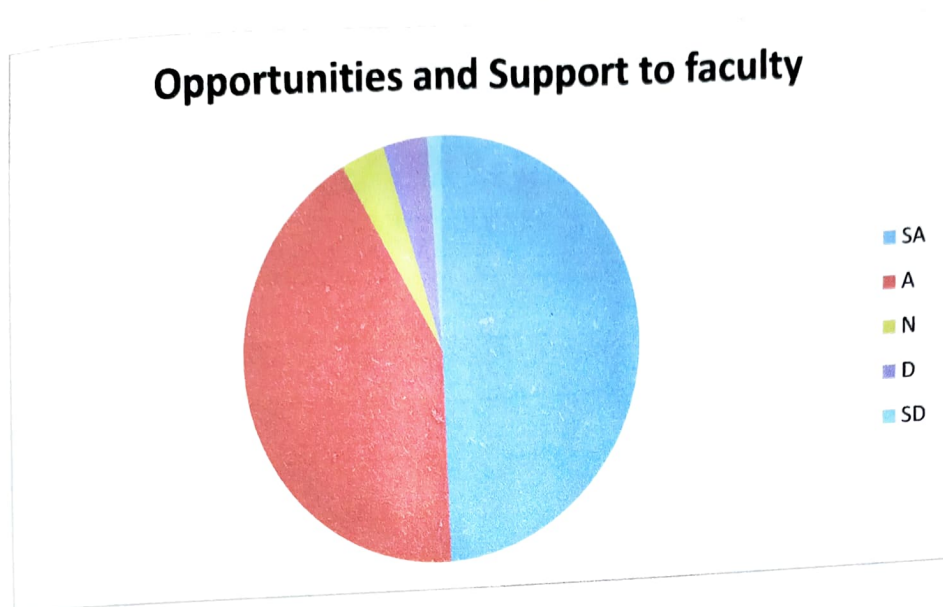

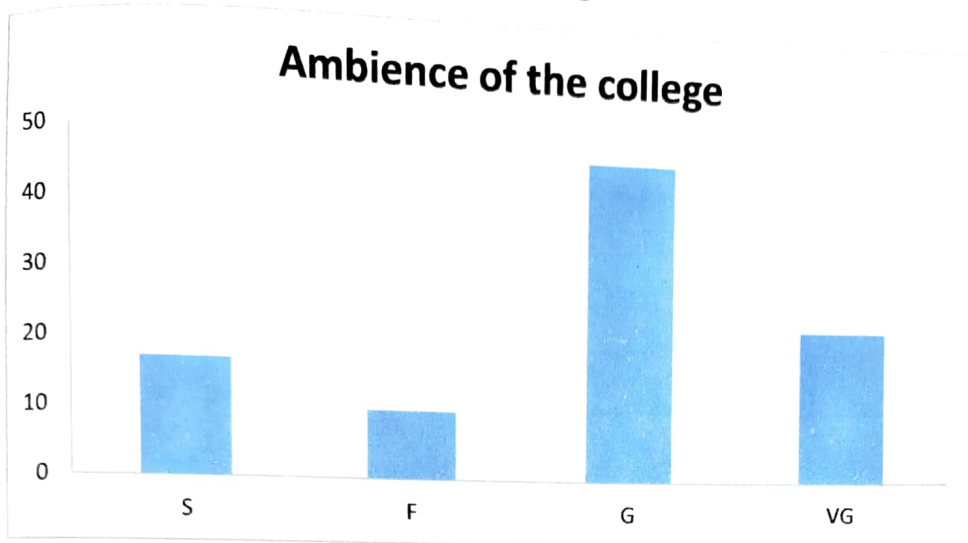

Table 1 highlighted the various aspects regarding admission procedure in which 23 percent were satisfied with process of admissions in college while 30 percent found it very good. Only 13 percent were satisfied with infrastructure and laboratory facility of the college while 57 percent marked the above facilities are good. 40 percent of the respondents found the faculty of the college to be good and very good. 40 percent of the alumni members found the quality of support material to be very good. Most of the respondents were satisfied with the facilities like library, canteen and hostel, provided by the institution. 40 percent of the respondents indicated the overall ranking of the university as very good. 47 percent of the alumni were pleased about the working of the alumni association.

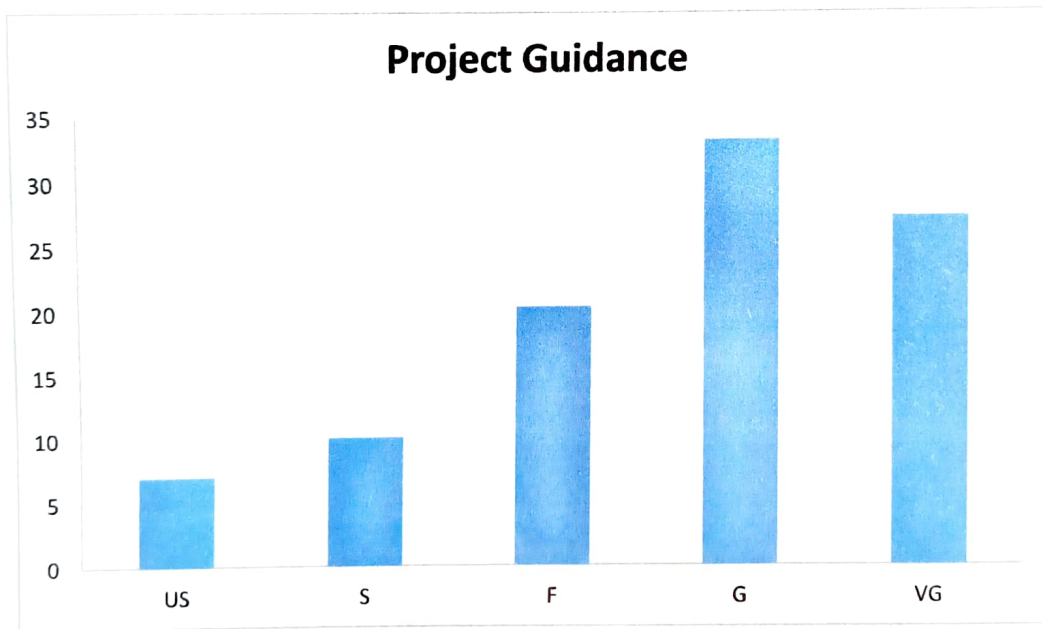

Above figure highlighted the ambience of college. 47 percent of the alumni found it good while 23 percent found it to be very good.

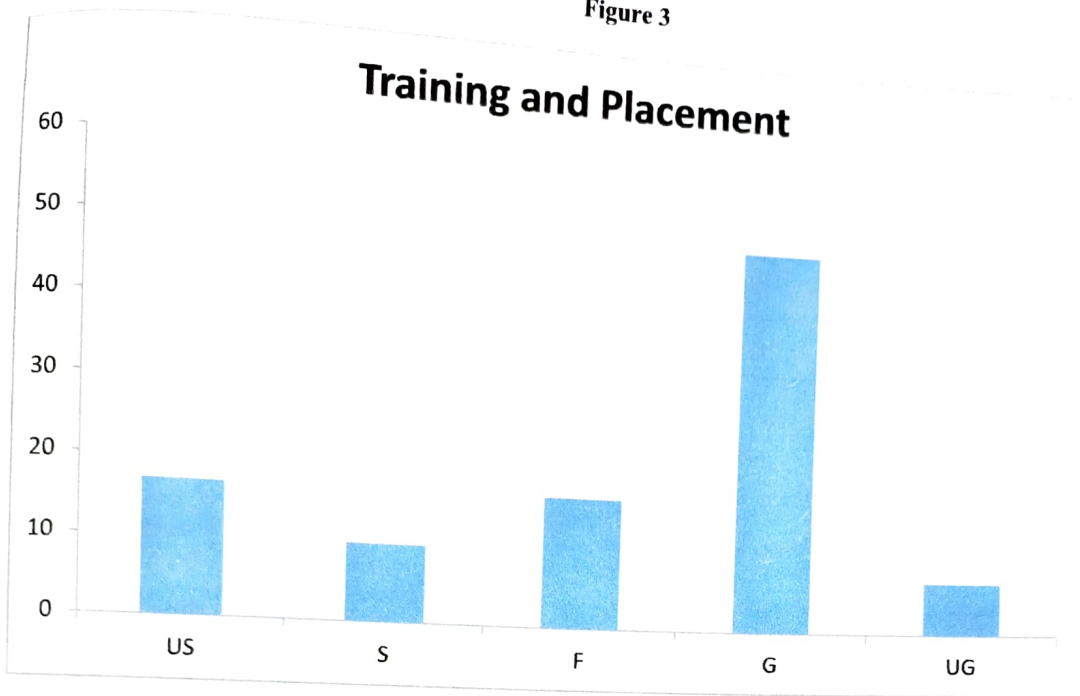

In figure 3, the data highlighted that half of the respondents were satisfied with the training and placement in the different areas of the society due to the high quality of education provided in the institute. However, 17 percent disagreed to this fact.

Suggestions were taken from respondents concerning relevance of curriculum in their job, need and change in curriculum and improvement in teaching and learning process. Some responded positively to the above queries. The alumni of the college suggested focus on project guidance and improvement in quality of support material. More training programs for students, need of time management. They also felt need of competitive exam books in library, smart classrooms in college, more focus on innovation and research. Some also suggested remedial classes for the weaker students in college. They were not happy with teacher student ratio in some subjects. Syllabus should be according to competitive point of view. There should be special classes for competitive exams. Positive and holistic environment towards leadership approach should be provided. Alumni meet should be done frequently. More job oriented courses must be added and extra assignments for faculty should be avoided

Analysis of Parent, Alumni and Faculty feedback forms

Feedback from different stakeholders of the institution was collected for the session 2023-24. On the basis of parents' feedback it was concluded that

1. Need of more washrooms especially for girls and their cleanliness.
2. Need for the improvement of college library in terms of seating capacity and more facilities like availability of computers, Photostat facility of library books etc.
3. Hygiene and cleanliness of college campus.
4. More seating capacity in canteen was also emphasized by parents.
5. Proper drinking water facility.
6. Need based requirement of repairwork was also stressed by the parents.
7. To control the indulgence of the outsiders in the campus.
8. Requirement of proper laboratories in some departments.

According to feedback from faculty

1. Need of more infrastructure in college like more classrooms, multi media classrooms and practical laboratories of chemistry and geography.
2. Regarding curriculum following suggestions were received like updation of curriculum from time to time, job oriented and practical approach of curriculum, all the stakeholders should be included in BoS.
3. More Skill development programs should be included in curriculum.
4. Requirement of proper laboratories for some departments.

According to feedback from Alumni

1. Need and change in curriculum and improvement in teaching and learning process.
2. Focus on project guidance and improvement in quality of support material required.
3. Requirement of more training programs for students.
4. Need of competitive exam books in library, smart classrooms in college.
5. More focus on innovation and research.
6. Remedial classes for the weaker students in college.
7. Teacher student ratio not satisfactory in some subjects.

8. Syllabus should be according to competitive point of view.

9. Special classes for competitive exams required.

10. Positive and holistic environment towards leadership approach should be provided.

11. Alumni meet should be done frequently.

12. More job oriented courses must be added and extra assignments for faculty should be avoided.
